AE-EXP-17-2315 24th Street Theatre Company <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$13,500	With support from the California Arts Council, 24TH STREET THEATRE COMPANY will provide 10 school field trips to see Enter Stage Right, a live theatrical production about the inner workings, and 20 supporting pre- and post-field trip classroom education experiences extending the learning experience. Approximately 1,000 K-5 students will benefit from arts education experiences aligned with California Visual and Performing Arts Standards.
AE-EXP-17-2436 A Noise Within <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$13,500	With support from the California Arts Council, A Noise Within will produce William Shakespeare's Othello for at least 2,500 students and teachers from at least 40 schools during Spring 2019. Performances for students include the same professional cast as regular performances. The experience includes pre-show engagement activities, a post-show conversation, and original study guides.

To enrich their experience, we will conduct 2 pre- and 1 post-play classroom workshops that fulfill VAPA Theater Arts standards. EVANGELINE dramatizes the pivotal 1968 Student Walkouts which sparked the Chicano Movement and is the largest student walkout in U.S. history.
AE-EXP-17-1556 Actors Gang Inc <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$13,500	With support from the California Arts Council, The Actors' Gang Education Department will collaborate with diverse, professional arts institutions to expose students in our 12 week in-school Commedia Workshops to performances and exhibitions that relate to our ongoing work with them. The goal is to provide underserved high school students with the opportunity to engage in art forms that support and deepen their understanding of the creative process.

<p>AE-EXP-17-2290 Encore Theatre Group <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$13,500</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, ENCORE THEATRE GROUP will provide tickets to approximately 2000 students in Title 1 schools in South Los Angeles to attend musical theatre performances at the Redondo Beach Performing Arts Center and the Warner Grand Theatre. Shows will feature professional technical elements, both adult and student actors, and a live orchestra led by a professional conductor. A curriculum guide with targeted learning activities will be provided to teachers.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-17-2418 Ensemble Theatre Company of Santa Barbara Inc <i>Santa Barbara County</i> \$15,050</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, the Ensemble Theatre Company will present the Student Matinee Program, which allows nearly 1,200 junior high and high school students to experience the power of live theater—often for the first time in their lives. Full-length plays take place at ETC's fully renovated New Vic theater and feature professional actors. The program includes free transportation and extensive play-specific curriculum materials to be used in classrooms pre- and post-show.</p>

<p>AE-EXP-17-2379 Geffen Playhouse Inc <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$17,100</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Geffen Playhouse will give high school youth who have no other access to the arts and are living in some of the most destitute neighborhoods of Los Angeles, a season-long immersive experience in theater arts that will awaken their appreciation of the arts as a great resource in their lives and will take their critical thinking skills, creativity and self-expression, confidence and their ability to empathize to new heights.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-17-2355 Gold Coast Chamber Players <i>Contra Costa County</i> \$7,125</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Gold Coast Chamber Players (GCCP) will expand its "Topics in Tempo" in-school educational outreach program to 4 schools in the Antioch Unified School Districts with high percentages of students from traditionally marginalized communities.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-17-2016 Golden Valley Music Society Inc <i>Riverside County</i> \$6,929</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, GOLDEN VALLEY MUSIC SOCIETY INC, with Academy of Ballet Arts, will present three live theater performances of Saint-Saens' Carnival of the Animals to all (about 1500) Murrieta School District fourth grade students. The program highlights music and dance in an engaging, aurally and visually appealing presentation of this classic work. Grant funds would pay for professional musicians, dance coaches/choreographers, production support and music rental.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-17-2047 Grand Vision Foundation <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$17,100</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, Grand Vision Foundation will serve 800 students at eight schools in San Pedro and Wilmington with its Roots of Music Program (RoMP). This semester-long program empowers 4th graders with in-school music lessons and engages them with interactive concert field trips. Students learn music fundamentals by studying African, American Folk and Mexican traditional music, while teachers use arts integration resources to extend learning in the classroom.</p>

The program will also feature a "master class" style instruction with Maestro Jose Hernandez and a student selected from South El Monte High School orchestra program.</p>

A grant of this magnitude would increase programming transportation, outreach and performing arts curriculum to 2,500 students that currently do not have the opportunity to participate.</p>

Class visits are structured using the Visual and Performing Arts Framework for California Public Schools K- 12, and follow the definition of an advance comprehensive art program. Funding will support educator salaries, art materials, insurance and facility overhead for approximately 800 student visits.</p>

We will also have a presentation by film composer, John Wineglass, who will compose live with help from the student audience. 100 high school orchestra students are invited to perform with our musicians and online resources will connect the concert to CA VAPA Standards.</p>
<p>AE-EXP-17-2356 Los Angeles Opera Company <i>Los Angeles County</i> \$15,300</p>	<p>With support from the California Arts Council, LA Opera will extend its exposure programs expanding to over 11,200 elementary students through the Elementary Student Matinee and Tour and new Open Door Days.
