The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730) ~~which that~~ contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, ~~it the standard code~~ may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached ~~Appendix~~ Appendices, designating ~~officials and employees~~ positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code for the ~~CALIFORNIA ARTS COUNCIL~~. California Arts Council.

~~Designated employees shall file statements of economic interest with the CALIFORNIA ARTS COUNCIL. The agency shall make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008). Upon receipt of the statements of the Council members and the Director, the agency shall make and retain a copy and forward the original to the Fair Political Practices Commission. Statements for all other designated employees will be retained by the agency. Council members and the Director must file their statement of economic interests electronically with the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other individuals holding designated positions must file their statements with the California Arts Council. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008.~~

The Director may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to comply fully with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.)

~~CATEGORY 1~~ CATEGORY 1

A designated ~~employee position~~ in this category ~~shall~~ must report investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) if the business entity or source is an ~~which are~~ arts organizations\* or art related business ~~entities and income, including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources which are arts organizations\* or art related business entities,~~ including non-profit arts organizations.\*

~~CATEGORY 2~~ CATEGORY 2

A designated ~~employee position~~ in this category must report investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income, (including receipt of gifts, loans, and travel payments) ~~from sources, which provide services, equipment, leased space, materials or supplies which are of the type to contract with the CALIFORNIA ARTS COUNCIL,~~ if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the California Arts Council.

CATEGORY 3

A designated position in this category must report investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the position's unit.

\*The term "arts organizations" includes, but is not limited to, museums, symphonies, orchestras, ballets, choruses, theaters, galleries, arts education institutes and arts service organizations.
