How It Works

Panelists independently review assigned applications online before meeting virtually to collaboratively rank applications. Rankings are then brought before the California Arts Council body to inform funding decisions.

Support

Panelists receive a \$100 honorarium for each day of the virtual panel convening. Panel meetings run approximately 1-3 days.
